Dr. John Bruchalski

Dr. John Bruchalski graduated from the University of South Alabama College of Medicine in Mobile, AL. During his training, he performed abortions out of a desire to help women, but soon realized

abortion did nothing of the sort. After a spiritual awakening, Dr. Bruchalski returned to the faith and felt God's call to start a clinic that truly helped women. In 1994, he founded Tepeyac Family Center, which offers much more than medicine: a faith-based, welcoming approach that takes all women regardless of belief, background, or financial means. He strives to combine the best of OB/Gyn quality medicine with caring for those in need while adhering to the teachings of the Catholic Church.

Dr. Bruchalski also founded Divine Mercy Care, a non-profitorganizationwhichfundstheroughly30% of Tepeyac patients who are in need. It addition, through this organization, he seeks to educate medical students and the broader community about merciful medicine.
